Scholars will spend a total of 6 nights and 7 days at camp. Please plan the amount of supplies needed accordingly.

- Twin sized bed linen (or sleeping bag)

- Deodorant
- Soap
- Lotion
- Shampoo
- Conditioner
- Active wear (tennis shoes required)
- Swim gear (only one piece bathing suits for females)
- Sunscreen

Please do not bring the following items to camp. If any of these items are brought we will confiscate them until departure and return them to the guardian only.

- Any valuables
- Food
- Drinks
- Technology devices*

*Students are allowed to bring cell phones only. Please note that they will not have free access to them only during scheduled times will they be allowed to use their devices.

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STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

For the safety and overall welfare of all EXERT Summer Camp participants, each student must read, agree, and adhere to the following terms of this document. Please remember that as a participant of the EXERT program, you are not only representing yourself but also serving as an ambassador of Tuskegee University as well as the Cooperative Extension Program. Your behavior during this trip will influence the impressions that others have, so keep this in mind during all activities of our trip.

Following are the conduct standards expected of each EXERT camp participant. Those who fail to adhere and abide by these standards may face dismissal from the program. If dismissed, the Tuskegee University Cooperative Extension Program is not obligated to refund any part of the fees associated with the EXERT Summer Camp, nor provide transportation for the participant's return.

AGREEMENT

- 1. As a student representative of Tuskegee University's Extension, Education and Research Track Summer Camp (EXERT), I will do my best to be aware of my role as a representative by retaining an open mind about what I see, experience, and do while participating in all activities. I will live up to what is expected of me.
- 2. I recognize that the EXERT Summer Camp counselors and chaperones are responsible for my safety and welfare. Therefore, I will cooperate with them by listening and following their directions at all times. Uncooperative participants may be asked to leave the camp and sent home at their own expense.
- 3. Possession or use of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs is prohibited. Smoking or using other tobacco products is also not permissible.
- 4. Possession of sexually explicit materials is prohibited. Computers, tablets, cellular phones, or other electronic devices may not be used to download, create, receive, forward, transmit, or view inappropriate, offensive, or sexually explicit communications, videos, or photographs.

- 5. Inappropriate language is not permitted.
- Shirts, shoes, and proper attire are required at all times. Sagging pants or revealing undergarments will not be allowed. During our visit to the water park, young ladies may wear only one-piece bathing suits; young men are expected to wear appropriate swim trunks.
- 7. No fraternization is allowed in participant's rooms. Please respect personal public property. Repair costs for any damages incurred to property will be charged to the responsible party.
- 8. Cellular phones will only be used at permitted times in the schedule, and will be taken up by the assigned camp counselor.

These codes of conduct are NOT subject to interpretation and each participant is expected to follow them without exception. The EXERT Summer Camp's primary goal is to provide a safe and secure environment for all our participants while at the YMCA Camp Chandler.
