

Montgomery Public Schools Academic Dual Enrollment for Dual Credit (DEDC) 2023-2024 School Year Guidance

<u>Alabama State University, Auburn University (Auburn First),</u> <u>Auburn University at Montgomery,</u> <u>Trenholm State Community College,</u> <u>Troy University (ACCELERATE),</u> South University, and <u>the University of Alabama Early College</u>

General Information

Dual Enrollment (DE) occurs when a student is enrolled in a college-level course while still in high school. College credit is earned and recorded on college transcript only.

Dual Enrollment for Dual Credit (DEDC) courses allow students to earn both high school and college credit at the same time. **Earned credits are recorded on both high school and college transcripts.**

Any MPS high school student who is interested in participating in academic DEDC courses must consult with his/her high school counselor, and receive prior written approval from his/her principal before enrolling in dual credit courses. Dual enrollment for dual credit replacement courses must be selected from the approved MPS Academic DEDC Approved Course Replacement List (beginning on page 5 of the guidance document).

Any student athlete who is interested in participating in academic DEDC coursework must meet and consult with his/her high school counselor and athletic director to review related NCAA requirements.

Student Eligibility/Qualifications

Students eligible to apply and enroll in this program must have a "B" average in completed high school courses, have written approval of the principal and the superintendent, and meet the entrance requirements established by postsecondary institutions. Letters of recommendation will not be issued from MPS in lieu of students' meeting postsecondary entrance requirements.

This program is open to all students in grades 10, 11, and 12. In accordance with Chapter 290-080-090.17 of the Administrative Code, exceptions may be made by the participating postsecondary institution for gifted and talented students enrolled in grades below grade 10 upon the recommendation of the high school principal and the superintendent.

Students who meet the criteria for initial admission for a DEDC program will maintain continuous eligibility so long as they earn a grade of C or better in all attempted college courses and maintain a "B" average in completed high school courses. Students who fail

to meet this minimum grade requirement or who withdraw from a course will be suspended from the program for a minimum of one term. The one-term suspension may not be served during the summer. The student may not re-enroll until the suspension has been served. For re-entry, the student must reapply to the program and must meet the minimum grade point average requirements.

Failing a DEDC course will cause the student to not receive college credit and equivalent high school credit, which may result in not graduating on time. Course grade information received from the postsecondary institution will be recorded on high school and college transcripts.

Placement in a high school level credit course will be guaranteed only for students withdrawing from a DEDC course within four weeks of the start of the semester. Students who miss high school coursework as a result of DEDC participation will be required to complete any missed assignments. It is the <u>responsibility of the student/parent to make</u> <u>sure proper postsecondary withdrawal procedures have been followed and proper</u> <u>documentation is given to the high school courselor</u>. Withdrawing after four weeks from the start of the semester may result in a loss of credit for that course.

Note: Students who withdraw from a DEDC course before the end of the academic term must provide official withdrawal documentation to their high school counselors to ensure that their schedules are adjusted. There is no guarantee that a student will be placed in a credit bearing course after withdrawing from a DEDC course. Withdrawals affect graduation eligibility. It is the responsibility of the student and parent to ensure that high school graduation requirements are met.

DEDC Courses

Eligible MPS students may participate in up to 2 approved DEDC courses per academic school year (June – May). No more than 1 DEDC course may be taken during a semester with the exception of the summer semester. Term courses must be taken in the same semester.

Student high school DEDC course **replacement** will be based on the MPS Academic DEDC Approved Course Replacement List (beginning on page 5 of guidance document).

Dual enrollment for dual credit courses offered by the postsecondary institution shall be of postsecondary/college level. <u>Students may be exposed to and be involved in discussions of mature subject- matter. Course curricula will not be modified.</u>

Courses at postsecondary institutions may not conflict with the student's regular high school schedule. Students may take either asynchronous online courses or face-to-face courses. Any face-to-face courses taken on postsecondary campuses should be scheduled at the end or outside of the student's scheduled school day, pending no other school-related or extracurricular activity scheduling conflicts.

Upon completion of DEDC courses, students must provide the high school with the final course grade. Evidence: official copy of student college/postsecondary transcript **or** official grade report from college/postsecondary.

DEDC Weighted Courses

Grading in Advanced Placement (AP)/Dual Enrollment courses taken for dual credit is the same as in all other courses. Grades, however, are to be weighted for purposes of honor roll, eligibility for honor clubs, rank in class, and GPA. That is, for example, A is to be one (1) point higher than a regular A; B is to be weighted as A; C is to be weighted as B; D is to be weighted as C; "Fs" are not to be weighted. A student who is enrolled in an AP or Dual Enrollment course must complete the entire scope and sequence of the course to fulfill requirements for graduation.

Course Transferability

It is very important for high school students who are planning to earn college credit through dual enrollment to consider the transferability of credits to the postsecondary institution that they plan to attend after high school. **Students/Parents are strongly encouraged to confirm earned credit transferability with the college that they plan to attend after graduation from high school prior to dual enrollment registration.** STARS Transfer Guide System: <u>http://stars.troy.edu/how_to_use_stars.html</u>

Transportation

Transportation is the responsibility of the parent or guardian of the student unless otherwise assumed by the LEA. If not assumed by the LEA, all costs associated with student transportation, including automobile insurance, traffic tickets, etc., would accrue to the student. The postsecondary institution or MPS assumes no responsibility or liability for students during the times they are commuting to the DE or DEDC site. [Reference: Ala. Tuition, Textbooks, and Other Fees

Tuition, textbooks, and other applicable fees for all academic dual enrollment courses are the responsibility of the students and/or their parents. <u>A student who participates in the academic DEDC program will be required to pay regular tuition as required by the postsecondary institution unless awarded an MPS DEDC scholarship or other scholarship.</u>

MPS scholarship funds cover tuition only. \$428.00 max. for 1 course/\$856.00 max. per academic school year for up to 2 courses. It is the responsibility of students and parents to cover the cost of course withdrawal and any other fees or charges incurred.

All questions about tuition should be directed to the postsecondary institution. Course tuition varies by institution. Approved scholarship funds cover tuition only. \$ 428.00 maximum for one course/\$856.00 maximum per academic school year (June – May) for up to two courses. Ask your high school counselor about scholarship opportunities.

Quick Steps

- Schedule a meeting with high school counselor to discuss eligibility and establish college/course options from the MPS Academic DEDC Approved Course Replacement List (beginning on page 5 of guidance document)
- 2. Research and review postsecondary options, application process, enrollment procedures, available courses and various deadlines for both MPS and the postsecondary institution of choice.
- 3. Complete the postsecondary enrollment process.
- 4. Complete and submit the MPS academic DEDC approval and scholarship forms to the high school counselor for consideration and principal approval prior to registering for any DEDC course(s). Copies of signed approval and scholarship forms will be given back to students within 7 working days. If these forms are not returned in 7 working days, reach out to the school to obtain the forms.
- 5. Students are to provide copies of their approval and scholarship form to their postsecondary dual enrollment contact. Their postsecondary contact will work with them to complete the enrollment/registration process adhering to MPS scheduling guidelines. (Complete and submit DEDC scholarship and student driver form as needed.) Students will not receive high school credit or scholarship funding for ANY COURSE taken that is not on the approval form.
- 6. Students will provide the high school counselor with proof of college course enrollment (e.g. college course schedule) no later than 7 working days after enrolling to ensure that DEDC courses are reflected on student schedules.
- 7. Steps 1 and 4-6 should be completed each fall, spring, or summer semester/ term.

Policy Manual Adopted February 26, 2019

7.7 Dual Enrollment The Alabama State Board of Education has authorized each local board of education, the State Department of Education, and the Department of Postsecondary Education to establish a program whereby high school students may enroll in postsecondary institutions in order to dually earn credits for a diploma/degree at both the high school and participating postsecondary levels. Courses may be offered after normal high school hours during the week day, on weekends, or in the summer. High school students may enroll in courses offered during the normal school day on or off the high school campus only with prior permission of the principal, the superintendent, and the applicable postsecondary institution president. If courses are offered off the high school campus during the school day, board of education policies shall address parent permission and travel.

Students eligible to apply and enroll in this program must be able to meet the entrance requirements established by the institutions of higher education, have a "B" average in completed high school courses, and have written approval of the principal and the superintendent.

This program is open to all students in grades 10, 11, and 12. In accordance with Chapter 290-080-

090.17 of the Administrative Code, exceptions may be made by the participating postsecondary institution for gifted and talented students enrolled in grades below grade 10 upon the recommendation of the high school principal and the superintendent. The Montgomery County Board of Education permits dual enrollment/dual credit under the rules of the Alabama Department of Education and Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and in conformance with appropriate policies and procedures of Montgomery Public Schools.

Transportation is the responsibility of the parent or guardian of the student unless otherwise assumed by the LEA. If not assumed by the LEA, all costs associated with student transportation, including automobile insurance, traffic tickets, etc., would accrue to the student. The postsecondary institution or MPS assumes no responsibility or liability for students during the times they are commuting to the DE or

Scholarship Details:

- Tuition scholarships are available for students who are taking academic DEDC courses through the postsecondary institutions listed above and are NOT receiving scholarship funds from other sources (including the state CTE funding).
- Scholarship funds are available for 1 DEDC course per semester or up to 2 DEDC term/quarter courses per semester. Scholarship funds will not exceed 2 courses per academic school year (August July)
- Scholarship funds are applicable for academic DEDC courses with prior approval.
- Scholarship funds cover **tuition only**. \$428.00 max. for 1 course/\$856.00 max. per academic school year for up to 2 courses. It is the responsibility of students and parents to cover the cost of course withdrawal and any other fees or charges incurred.
- Scholarship funds for tuition will be paid directly to the postsecondary, not to the student.
- Student must earn a minimum grade of C in each completed course. Students who do not maintain good academic standing and complete coursework may be subject to repayment of scholarship funds.
- Scholarships are open to all MPS students who meet the eligibility requirement listed in the MPS Academic DEDC Guidance and the scholarship details.
- Students awarded scholarships must provide proof of postsecondary enrollment before being added to the high school's scholarship cohort list.
- Scholarship and approval forms must be submitted to high schools by designated system due dates.
